A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Volunteers, Equipment Donors, Beneficiaries and general supporters,

Our sixth year of operation brought us so many amazing successes that deciding which ones to include in this year's report was a seriously difficult task. Of all this year's accomplishments, the biggest had to have been hitting the milestone of \$5M worth of equipment donated since our founding in 2013. This summer we surpassed that milestone when we helped Randallstown High School launch a girl's lacrosse program by providing \$5,000 worth of lacrosse equipment to their athletic department.

Additionally, we saw a continuation of our rapid growth in our Baltimore Chapter where we distributed almost \$750,000 worth of equipment to 143 programs in just our second year of operation. We were also thrilled to receive a brand new van and trailer from the Baltimore Ravens to assist with the rapid growth of our program. We can't wait to showcase our new Ravens-branded vehicle this Spring when we will be out at sporting events every weekend running collection drives.

Another bright spot this year was the launch of our new social enterprise operation, Gear 4 Good. As we have continued to grow over the past six years we have consistently searched for sustainable sources of revenue to maintain our capacity to handle this growth and continue providing resources to our communities. This year we launched an e-commerce operation to sell our surplus equipment and we are eager to see that part of the organization grow in 2020.

As we look forward to the year ahead, we are anxious to execute our lofty goals we have set for year seven. We will be working incredibly hard throughout the year to develop new community partnerships aimed at expanding our impact on students in need as we continue to work towards a world where every child has the ability to participate in youth sports no matter what their economic situation is. We get to hear every day from our partners about what our equipment has meant for their participation rates, but we know that there is a ton more work to do.
